Am: Participate on a spies and detectives walk from SOE to MI5. Learn why Londoners loved their Hokey Pokeys at the coolest museum in town.


Pm: Lunch with a slow view. Learn of the first social network and take a hidden journey underground.


Day 4: London (Mon, 21 Mar) **B**
